### CAN HUMANITY GET IT RIGHT? START WITH THE CHILDREN

ye been watching the news a lot recently. It has left me with a lot less trust in humanity to get things right. The weight of our human frailties will crush us if it's only ourselves we believe in.

In today's reading, the apostles ask Jesus to increase their faith. He tells them that for anyone with even a small amount of faith, nothing is impossible. But it can't rest there. They need to draw on a close relationship with God, for they are called to be witnesses.

# The Baltimore Community Alert Group are organising a Property Branding Day on Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> October 2025 at the Baltimore Sailing Club from 11am to 2pm.

The idea behind property branding is to ensure when an item that is branded is stolen or lost it can be returned to the owner. Not all items have a serial number and not many of us have a list of property serial numbers. Gardai often find stolen goods and cannot trace them to their owners due to a lack of marking. The items will be branded with your Driver licence number (4d) and this number can be tracked by the Gardai and the property returned to its owner.

Examples of items for branding are: Laptops, Tablets, Phones, Tools, Power tools, Chainsaws, Lawnmowers, Ride on Lawnmowers, Bikes, Electric Bikes, Quad Bikes, Musical Instruments or any other valuables.

This is a free service but a donation to the Baltimore Lifeboat / RNLI would be welcome.
