## Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

Holy Week begins on this Sunday, which joins the foretelling of Christ's regal triumph and the proclamation of the Passion. The connection between both aspects of the paschal mystery should be shown and explained in the celebration and catechesis of this day. The commemoration of the entrance of the Lord into Jerusalem is celebrated with a solemn procession which may take place only once, before the Mass which has the largest attendance, even if this should be the evening of Saturday or Sunday. In this procession the faithful carry palm or other branches. The priest and the ministers, also carrying branches, precede the people.

The palms or branches are blessed so that they can be carried in the procession. The palms should be taken home, where they will serve as a reminder of the victory of Christ which they celebrated in the procession. Pastors should make every effort to ensure that this procession in honour of Christ the King be so prepared and celebrated that it is of great spiritual significance in the life of the faithful.

Holy Week: During Holy Week, the Church celebrates the mysteries of salvation accomplished by Christ in the last days of his life on earth, beginning with his messianic entrance into Jerusalem. The Lenten season lasts until the Thursday of this week. The Easter Triduum begins with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper. The days of Holy Week, from Monday to Thursday inclusive, have precedence over all other celebrations. It is not fitting that Baptism and Confirmation be celebrated on these days.

# **Reflection on Holy week.**

Did you know that it is not Christmas that is the most Sacred Time of the year for Catholics but Holy week? During Christmas we celebrate the birth of the Lord which is indeed a beautiful time; However, during Holy week we are called to meditate on the gift of salvation that God offers to each of us if we choose to accept it. We are invited to enter into the paschal Mystery. As Christians we are invited to follow Jesus Christ, to embrace His passion, death, Resurrection, and Ascension which we identify as a faith event that we call the "Paschal mystery". The Catechism of the Catholic Church states its theological meaning as follows, the "Paschal mystery has two aspects: by his death, Christ liberates us from sin; by his Resurrection, he opens for us the way to a new life. This new life is above all justification that reinstates us in God's grace, "so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life."

The Easter Saturday Vigil this year will be a Diocesan Celebration. Mass will be offered in the Cathedral of St Mary and St Anne at 9pm on Holy Saturday. Bishop Fintan Gavin will be the celebrant. The mass can be viewed live on https://www.corkcathedral.ie/live-stream/

# What is the Chrism Mass?

On Holy Thursday morning the Bishop, joined by the priests of the diocese, gather at the Cathedral to celebrate the Chrism Mass. This Mass manifests the unity of the priests with their Bishop. During this mass the Bishop blesses three oils — **the oil of catechumens** which is used at Baptism to strengthen the one been baptized to turn away from evil, temptation and sin; **the oil of the infirmorum** which is used by priests to anoint someone at the hour of death to prepare the soul to stand before God and finally he blesses the **oil of holy chrism**— which will be used to anoint the hands of a newly ordained priest at his ordination and during the administration of the sacrament of confirmation. Whilst it will not be possible this year for priests to gather with their Bishop to celebrate this mass; Bishop Gavin will still celebrate this mass online.
