## Miracle of the Sun at Fatima

Did you know that the greatest miracle since the resurrection took place at Fatima, Portugal on October 13<sup>th</sup> 1917 and was witnessed by up to 100,000 people? Not only that, but the miracle in question was foretold by the Blessed Virgin Mary to three Sheppard children whom she was appearing too. She told them that on the final apparition which took place on October 13<sup>th</sup> she would perform a miracle so that all would believe she appeared there. Many people gathered that day as sceptics; many gathered as complete nonbelievers and even began to mock the children but by the end of the apparition people were on their knees begging God for mercy. What could have happened to cause such a reaction and such a change of heart. It was the phenomena called the miracle of the sun. On that day thousands and thousands of people witness the sun spin around the sky, defying all cosmic law. People
