He incurred much opposition and died in exile. Patron saint of preachers.</li> <li>14<sup>th</sup>: The Exaltation of the Holy Cross. The discovery of the True Cross is dated to 14 September 320. On 13 September 335 the churches on Calvary were dedicated and the cross that St Helena discovered was venerated there the next day. The annual commemoration of that event has been celebrated since, in praise of the redemption won for us by Christ.</li> <li>15<sup>th</sup>: Our Lady of Sorrows. Mary, standing by the cross, 'suffered intensely with her only begotten Son and united herself as his Mother to his sacrifice, consenting with</li> <li>love to the offering of the victim who was born of her', whom she also offered to the eternal Father</li> <li>16<sup>th</sup>: St Cornelius became pope in 251 and died in exile at Civitavecchia in 253. Patron for cattle and domestic animals. St Cyprian, 210-58, bishop of Carthage, teacher and preacher, martyred.</li> <li>17<sup>th</sup>: St Robert Bellarmine, 1542-1621, Jesuit, Cardinal Bishop of Capua, involved in theological controversies of the time. ## Important Notice from Bishop Fintan Gavin, 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2021

Following Tuesday's government announcement on *Reframing the Challenge, continuing our Recovery and Reconnecting* of new public health measures all religious ceremonies can proceed with up to 50% of church capacity while still being **subject to appropriate protective measures including social distancing between household groups, wearing of face coverings, sanitisation on entry and exit and good ventilation.** 

Since churches re-opened for public worship in June 2020 we are indebted to the voluntary support of church stewards, those who clean and sanitise churches, parish ministries and church personnel who have worked so hard to ensure that we could joyfully and safely gather for public worship. Many people have contacted me to say how grateful they are to yourselves and all those who work with you for this.

### **First Penance and First Holy Communion**

Arrangements for the celebration of First Penance and First Holy Communion can be made in parishes to take place **from** Monday 6<sup>th</sup> September. In some parishes celebrations remain to take place from 2020 and these should be given priority.

In calculating the number of ceremonies it is important to include the child and parents as a minimum. Your church's capacity will dictate whether or not you will be able to go beyond that.

### **Sacrament of Confirmation**

Arrangements for the celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation can be made in parishes to take place **from** Monday  $6^{th}$  September. In some parishes celebrations remain to take place from 2020 and these should be given priority.

In calculating the number of ceremonies it is important to include the child, the parents and the sponsor as a minimum. Your church's capacity will dictate whether or not you will be able to go beyond that.

### Funerals

Attendance at a Funeral Mass now follows the same guideline as other Masses. At the moment, the current practice of receiving the remains of the deceased before the Funeral Mass will continue. Following consultation with the Priests Council a <u>Diocesan Policy for Funerals is under</u> preparation.

### **Pastoral Life of the Parish**

As we cautiously move to up to 50% of church capacity for public worship this is also a time to remobilise much of parish life. I encourage you to meet with your Parish Pastoral Council, Parish Finance Committee, Safeguarding Representatives and other parish ministries to do this collaboratively.

This is also a time to re-engage altar servers, young readers and other groups whose participation in parish life has been restricted during the pandemic. Specific guidance for church choirs will be made available in the coming weeks and we look forward to welcoming the return of their important role in our liturgies.
