### Feasts this week

18<sup>th</sup>:St Luke was a physician from a Gentile Christian milieu. He was with St Paul on his second missionary journey and during his imprisonment in Rome. After Paul's death he is reputed to have worked in Greece. In art, he is represented by an ox. Patron of butchers, bookbinders, doctors, surgeons, artists and glassworkers.

19<sup>th</sup>: St Paul of the Cross, 1 694-1775, founded the Passionists in Rome, preaching on the Passion of Christ and tending the sick, the dying and the lapsed

**22nd:St John Paul II** was pope for over twenty-six years from 22 October 1978, the inauguration of his ministry as universal Pastor of the Church, until his death on 2April 2005. Ordained Bishop of Krakow in 1958 and took a significant part in the Second Vatican Council. As Bishop of Rome he visited almost all of the Roman parishes and made apostolic journeys to 104 countries, including Ireland, 29 September-2 October 1 979.

**23rd:** St **John of Capistrano**, 1386-1456, studied civil and canon law and joined the Franciscan Order. A faithful servant of four popes, he attended the Council of Florence, went to Jerusalem as apostolic emissary, and, in 1451, set out on a preaching tour through the German provinces and Poland. In a battle at Belgrade he contracted fever and died there. Patron saint of jurists and military chaplains.

An Act of Spiritual Communion - My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. , I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen

**St Luke:** If Luke was the author of the third Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles, the course and nature of his ministry may be sketched in more detail from both texts. He excludes himself from those who were eyewitnesses of Christ's ministry. He indicates participation in the Pauline mission by the use of the first person in the "we" sections of Acts. They suggest that Luke shared in instructing persons in the Christian message and possibly in performing miraculous healings.

### Parishioners wishing to receive Holy Communion but unable to attend Mass

Over the past few months people have had the opportunity to put a Pyx on the altar before Mass at the weekend. Once Communion has been distributed at Mass Fr Michael or Fr Evin put the Host into the Pyx alongside the number required ie: 1,2 or 3 etc. After Mass has concluded people take their Pyx from the altar. This allows those who are unable to attend Mass to participate in some way and ensures Fr Michael and Fr Evin first Friday calls don't occur on the same day as Holy Communion is received. Should anyone wish to avail of this a Pyx can be place on the altar and the names of the recipient given to Bernie (Sacristan) before Mass.

### Lay Led Liturgy

Pre Covid a Lay Led Liturgy Service used to take place in St Patrick's Cathedral on weekdays at 9.30am. This took place when the priests were unable to say mass due to illness, retreat or other commitments. This gives the parishioners the opportunity to gather in prayer and receive the Sacrament of Communion. The Lay Led Liturgy will become more essential as time goes on due to the lack of priests in the Diocese. Volunteers are required to enable this to continue.
