
Feasts this Week

24th: **St Anthony Mary Claret,** 1807-70, founded the Claretians in Spain formissionary work. Archbishop of Santiago, Cuba, then returned as chaplain to the Queen of Spain, and built schools and museums, before being exiled with themonarchy.

25th: Bl. Thaddeus MacCarthy was born in 1455. **Tadhg Mac**

Cárthaigh (Latinised and anglicised Thaddeus McCarthy) c. 1455 – 25 October 1492, was an Irish ecclesiastic. He was a bishop who never ruled his see, even though he was appointed to two of them: Bishop of Ross, Ireland in 1482 and Bishop of Cork and Clovne in 1490. His feast day is 25 October.

His appointment as Bishop of Ross was opposed and Innocent VIII thenappointed him Bishop of Cork and Cloyne. He set out as a humble pilgrim toRome where he was confirmed as Bishop of Cork and Cloyne. On his returnjourney in 1492 he died at Ivrea in Italy.



27th: St Otteran, a descendant of Conall Gulban, is usually identified with Odhran who preceded Columba in Iona. His death is recorded in 548 and hisgrave was greatly revered in Iona. He was chosen by the Vikings as patron of thecity of Waterford in 1096 and later patron of the diocese.

28th: **Ss Simon and Jude.** The teaching of the apostles is the living Gospel for all tohear. Their authority comes from their fidelity to Christ and his message. SaintJude is patron saint of hopeless causes. **29th: St Colman** hailed from Kilmacduagh, Co. Galway, in the seventhcentury. After studying in Aran, where he founded two churches on Inis Mor, here turned to make a foundation at Kilmacduagh.

Message from Bishop Fintan Gavin

As we enter into the new pastoral year it appears that we will have to learn to live with covid in the safest way possible.

Reception of Holy Communion

People may receive either in the hand or on the tongue.

Face Coverings

While people are no longer obliged to wear face coverings in churches some may continue to do so by choice. However, for the distribution of Holy Communion, Priests, Deacons and Ministers of the Eucharist should continue to wear a face covering and to sanitise their hands before and after distributing Holy Communion.

Taking Up of Offertory and Second Collections

It is important that all offertory and separate second collections are restored and taken up as in pre covid times during the celebration.

Parish Ministries

All ministries such as choirs, music ministry, Ministers of the Word, Ministers of the Eucharist, altar servers, funeral ministry, baptism ministry and other such parish groups should be reinstated.

The 'Do This in Memory' parish programme in preparation for the celebration of the Sacrament of First Holy Communion as well as parish based Confirmation preparation programmes are to resume.

Livestreaming of Masses

While livestreaming of Masses was valuable during the pandemic, it's not a real substitute for being present inperson to participate in the gathering of the faith community. Understandably people with health or age-related restrictions will still need to participate in Mass via livestream and in order for this to happen, I would ask that parishes continue to livestream a limited number of Masses.

Additional Weekend Masses

Additional Weekend Masses that were arranged during the pandemic should be finally discontinued.

Holy Water Fonts

Holy Water should be available in Fonts.

Station Masses

There is no reason why Station Masses cannot be estored. This again will depend on how the virus behaves during the winter months.

I appreciate that as we continue to live with covid this brings its own challenges so I would urge you to use common sense and your own judgement.
