ST BRIGID,

'Muire na nGael' — pray for us

Rebruary 1, Lá Fhéile Bríde, heralds the coming of spring, signalling the end of winter darkness, and the beginning of a new season of hope and growth. This feast day, predated by the Celtic festival

of Imbolic (*imb+fholc* meaning to immerse or cleanse) associated with fertility and new life, continued through Christianity.

According to tradition 'Chaith Bríd tamall dá saol ar Oileán Bríde' (Rabbit Island, off the coast of Myross parish). Local folklore is rich with 'evidence' of this.

Tobar Bríde, (Biddy's Well) once located on the island, was supposedly transferred to Drom na Cille, in the townland of Ardra directly opposite the island, in an 'ámhscarnach' (magical dawn mist), because of the desecration of the well by a local 'cábóg', or the drown-

ing of pilgrims retuning from the island. People visit this Holy Well on Lá Fhéile Bríde to pray, or leave daffodils, or a votive offering. The water is reputed to have healing properties – in particular a cure

for blindness. Bubbling or spouting of the water, believed to be the action of the saint, or the sighting of an eel, is to expect a cure.

The formation of Lough Cluthir (on the left side of the road from Union Hall to Reen Pier) is also attributed to St. Brigid who

caused a spring to become a lake because the local chieftain refused to give her milk.

On 30 June 1929, Union Hall church was dedicated to St Brigid, on the centenary of Catholic Emancipation.

- Three churches on the south coast of our diocese are dedicated to St Brigid: Ballydehob, Crosshaven and Union Hall, and the ancient Kilcrea Abbey (near Ovens).
- The new St Brigid Bank Holiday (Feb 6 this year) honours those who died in the pandemic and the frontline healthcare workers who worked so hard to protect us.

Wednesday the 1st February 2023 – St. Brigid, Abbess, Secondary Patron of Ireland. St. Brigid – Legend has it that she was a pupil of St. Patrick and became famous for her kindness, mercy, and her miracles. St. Brigid is Ireland's first native saint, the most celebrated Irish female saint. St. Brigid founded Ireland's most famous mixed (male and female) monastery in Co. Kildare, along with the hermit Conleth who served as bishop and St. Brigid as abbess. Some would say that the legends about a St. Brigitte echo myths and legends about the three-faced Celtic fertility goddess Brigid – the goddess of war, poetry, crafts, and healing. This goddess Brigid was celebrated in pre-Christian times on the 1st of February, and like many other pagan feasts they were adapted by Christians.

St. Brigid's Cross (Bogha Bride) is a symbol of the day. Traditionally, reeds are collected from the fields and crafted into a cross. St. Brigid's Day is now a Bank Holiday in Ireland, introduced to recognise the enormous sacrifices made by the Irish people, in particular the frontline workers, during the Covid pandemic.

Thursday 2nd of February 2023 – The Presentation of the Lord (World Day for Consecrated Life). Known originally as the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord is a relatively ancient celebration, earlier than the fourth century. The feast celebrates the presentation of Christ in the temple at Jerusalem on the 40th day after His birth to fulfil the Jewish law. Inspired by the words of the Canticle of Simeon, ("a light to the revelation of the Gentiles"), by the eleventh century, the custom had developed to bless candles on the Feast of the Presentation. Because of this, the feast also became known as Candlemas. This emphasis on light, as well as the timing of the feast, falling as it does in the last weeks of winter, it reminds us that darkness will not prevail, but we have the light of Jesus revealed to us. Today also celebrates all those who have

consecrated their lives to Jesus, in the past, present and we hope long into the future. **Friday 3rd of February 2023 – Feast of St. Blaise, Bishop and Martyr.** The blessing of St. Blaise is a sign of our faith of God's protection and love for us and for the sick. Since the eighth century he was venerated as patron of those who suffer from disease of the throat. Using two crossed and unlighted candles, the minister touches the throat of each person, saying, 'Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop, and martyr, may God deliver you from all ailments of the throat and from every other evil. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.'

Blessing of Candles will take place at the 9.30am Morning Mass on Thursday 2nd February 2023 the feast of the Presentation of the Lord. People are invited to bring candles to this Mass if they wish to have them blessed.

Blessing of Throats – will take place at the 9.30am Mass on Friday 3rd February 2023, the Feast of St. Blaise.

The Skibbereen Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) meeting will take place on Thursday the 2nd February at 7.00pm in the Presbytery, North Street.

Second Collection - There will be a second collection **next weekend the 11th & 12th February** in support of the Lourdes Pilgrimage. The Collection goes to support the efforts to bring as many sick people to Lourdes as possible along with the numerous Doctors, Nurses, Volunteer Carers, and Volunteer Youths and for all the equipment, medication, and care items needed.
