OUR CATHEDRAL'S BIG BIRTHDAY IS APPROACHING

S aint Patrick's Cathedral, Skibbereen, which in its title honours the patron saint of Ireland, is soon to celebrate the first 200 years of its existence. The foundation was laid in 1825; from 1826, the Cathedral was open for worship.

By the early 1800s, a previous Skibbereen chapel, located in the burial ground immediately east of Home Rule Terrace, had reached an advanced stage of decay. In 1814, Fr Michael Collins had come to Skibbereen as PP of the then parish of Creagh and Tullagh. He it was who planned and raised funds to build a new cathedral at the top end of North Street. A man of remarkable drive and ability, he continued to reside in Skib-

Or email jheinhold@gmail.com bereen, spending the last two years of his life as Bishop of Cloyne and Ross. Following his sudden death at the age of 51 in 1832, he was interred in the soil under the cathedral he had built.

In the mid-1840s, three internal galleries, not part of the original design, were added. These concided with the visit to Skibbereen of Fr Theolbald Mathew, the temperance crusader. But the changes carried out by George Ashlin on the instructions of Bishop William Fitzgerald in 1881-1882 must be seen as the most radical in the cathedral's history. The wall behind the original high altar was opened and a semi-circular apse added, embellished by three stained-gloass windows. The cathedral was re-configured to full cruciform shape. In 1948-1950, extensive repairs were carried out by Bishop Denis Moynihan, who subsequently travelled to Rome to have the building's status raised from pro-Cathedral to full Cathedral, a title it retains to this day.

Last week we began to look at the three Lenten actions of Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving. We reflected on Prayer in last week newsletter. Let us look at **Fasting** this week. Questions people frequently have about the Lenten fasting are: Why is it important? Is it required? And what's the history of fasting in the Church? Today, people talk about fasting in different ways, often with enhancing physical health. Spiritually speaking fasting has a different meaning. What does it mean to fast in Lent? To fast is to abstain from food. There is a distinction between fasting and abstinence in Lent. When we use abstinence in reference to Lent, we are speaking about regulating the quantity of food that is taken or abstaining from something we enjoy eating e.g. chocolate, cake etc. Traditionally anyone from the age of 14 is asked to abstain for the 40 days of Lent. When we use fasting, we are thinking more about the days of Ash Wednesday and Good Friday where we abstain from meat or food altogether.

Traditionally those between the ages of 18-59 are asked to fast on these two days and abstain from meat on Fridays. Fasting in the Church is an ancient practice as a sign of sorrow and repentance for sins. In the Old Testament fasting also accompanied fervent prayer to God. The idea was that fasting made one's prayer more acceptable to God. It was a way of demonstrating one's level of commitment before the Lord. As the adage goes, actions speak louder than words. In the New Testament, the Lord Jesus does not seem to emphasise fasting while his disciples are with him. When questioned about this by John's disciples, Jesus insists that fasting is inappropriate in times of joy. In saying this, he compared himself to the bridegroom and his disciples to wedding guests. Jesus notes however that when the bridegroom is taken away, then there will be fasting, which seems to imply fasting as a sign on mourning the loss of the bridegroom and also in anticipation of the preparation for his return. In the concept of anticipation and preparation for the Lord Jesus we find a connection to the practice of fasting and abstinence during Lent. Lent is a time of penance and atonement for sin in preparation for the celebration of the resurrection of the Lord at Easter, and this is why we fast for Lent.
