s part of the Easter Triduum from Holy Thursday to Easter Sunday, we will have a number of celebrations in the churches of our Family of Parishes. We'll celebrate Holy Thursday in each place, and also Good Friday.

But this year, instead of having Easter Vigils in every church (often with many empty seats), our Family of Parishes is coming together to celebrate the Easter Vigil in St. Patrick's Cathedral, Skibbereen — the most significant liturgy of our year.

Each parish will participate in this joint celebration; this night will stand out above all other nights. We will joyfully praise Christ's victory over death, redeemed from sin.

Easter is the central holiday of Christianity, followed by Christmas. It honours

the Resurrection of Jesus after his death by crucifixion. It's the joyful conclusion to the Lenten season of devoted prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

The definition of Easter is: 'an annual Christian festival in commemoration of the resurrection of Jesus Christ, observed on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the spring equinox'.

The significance of Easter is Jesus Christ's triumph over death, and eternal life granted to all who believe in him. Easter confirms fully all that Jesus taught and preached during his three-year ministry. His resurrection provides final and undeniable proof that he is the Son of God. It affirms Jesus of Nazareth as the prophesied Messiah of Israel and the King and Lord of a new Jerusalem: a new heaven and a new earth.

So, let's join together on this wonderful and grace-filled night of nights, praising our God together for the greatest event in history — Christ's resurrection, and our redemption.

We extend our condolences to the family of Bridget (Bridie) Fahy (née Greene) Skibbereen (formerly of Dungloe, Donegal) who died recently.

Holy Week - A simple way to walk with Jesus. The week between Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday, Holy Week, is the most sacred time of year for us. During this special time, we enter the passion of Christ – his crucifixion, death, and resurrection - through liturgical celebration and personal conversion. While the season of Lent and our Lenten actions (prayer, fasting, and almsgiving) are important, they are meant as preparation for the three days of the Triduum: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Vigil/Easter Sunday. Christ redeemed us all and gave perfect glory to God through his paschal mystery: dying he destroyed our death and rising he restored our life. Lent officially ends and the Triduum begins at dusk on Holy Thursday and continues through dusk on Easter Sunday. We can say it is one celebration that lasts for three days. We do not spend all the three days in church, but we gather at various times in church to celebrate and remember the saving action of Christ. Holy Thursday - The evening Mass begins the sacred Triduum. On this night, we remember the Last Supper and celebrate the institution of the Eucharist and the Sacrament of Holy Orders. The Holy Thursday liturgy includes the experience of foot washing. This recalls Jesus washing the feet of his apostles and is a powerful example of

how we are called to serve and care for one another. At the end of the liturgy, the sanctuary is stripped clean in preparation for the most sombre of feasts, **Good Friday** - Good Friday - is a sombre remembrance of Jesus' crucifixion and death on the cross. It is a day of fasting and penance and a time to examine all the places in our lives where we fail to follow Christ and fall into sin. The church is bare on Good Friday, the altar stripped of ornamentation and the tabernacle left open and empty. Good Friday is a day of mourning. The high point on Good Friday is the service of the passion and it is divided into reading of the Passion, Veneration of the Cross, and reception of the Eucharist. Christ's passion is read from the Gospel of John and concludes with the prayers of the faithful, offered for the unity of the universal Church. The Veneration of the Cross is a time for the faithful to individually revere the Cross and ponder the enormity of Christ's salvific act. Holy Communion is then distributed, and the priest, along with the entire congregation, departs in silence.

Holy Saturday - The Easter Vigil is the high point in the Church liturgical year. The Vigil begins in darkness (usually outside), and the procession of candlelight that enlivens the church reminds us that Jesus is the light of the world who has conquered all darkness and death. The Paschal candle which is lit at the Easter Vigil will remain in the church throughout the year as a sign of Christ's death and resurrection. If there are no sacraments of initiation at the Easter Vigil, we bless Holy Water and as a community of believers, we renew our own baptismal promises. We recommit ourselves to Christ by once again rejecting sin and accepting the freedom that comes from living as children of God. The Vigil concludes with reception of the Eucharist, the Body, and Blood of Jesus, we are ready to celebrate Easter. The tomb is empty. There is Light in the darkness. Alleluia, Christ has risen!

Eucharistic Adoration takes place this Monday from **10am to 6pm in the Adoration Chapel** of the Cathedral. Please note there will be no Eucharistic Adoration on Good Friday.

Special Collection for The Holy Places will be taken up on Good Friday.

Reminder: Please return your Trócaire Boxes to the church, so all monies collected can be forwarded to Trócaire.

Collection for Priests: The collection at the Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday and on Easter Sunday is for the Priests of the parish. The Bishop allows only two days in the year when the offertory collection is given to the Priests – Christmas and Easter. All other collections are for the running of the Parish.

Easter Offering envelopes are available in all the Churches. Just bring your own envelopes along with you and they will be returned to the respective parish.
