# DID CIARÁN BRING THE FAITH TO WEST CORK, AHEAD OF ST PATRICK?

Á le Ciarán, St. Ciarán's Day, is celebrated on Cape Clear on March 5th. For centuries it was a holyday of obligation on the island. No work was done on land or sea. All able-bodied people visited Tobar Chiaráin (St. Kieran's Well) on this special day, which took precedence even over St. Patrick's Day.

Tradition in Cape Clear holds that the first Christian church in Ireland was built here and the first Mass said. The Annals of Inisfallen seem to verify that Ciarán preached Christianity before Patrick. The annals state that Ciarán was born on Cape Clear in AD 352, that he studied in

SAINT CIARÁN, BISHOP - FEAST DAY 5 MARCH -God of heaven and earth, graciously hear our prayer as we recall the memory of Saint Ciarán, who rejoiced in your gift of life to all creation, and give us the fulness of life in the new creation. Through Christ our Lord. Amen. Rome for 20 years and returned to preach in AD 402, first on his island home and then all over Corca Laighe (between Kinsale and Kenmare). He then became Bishop of Seir, Co. Offaly, where his father was born. He founded Christainity in both the diocese of Ossory and of Ross, but was patron of neither diocese. They had a saying in Cape Clear "*Nior tháinig Pádraig thar Léim anoir. Bhí Ré na Críostaíochta bunaithe ann cheana féin ag Ciarán agus a dheartháir Céim* (Patrick never came west beyond Leap. Christianity had already been established there by Ciarán and his brother Céim)".

Ciarán is venerated also in Cornwall (as St Piran), Wales, Brittany and in Scotland at the Mull of Kintyre and on the Western Isles. Everywhere, he is likened to Francis of Assisi, in his love for animals and birds. In an age of consumerism and greed, it is important that Ciarán's name and his life are not forgotten. His faith, his simple lifestyle, his love of people, animals and birds should inspire us.
