PARISH LEADERSHIP TEAM – Over the weeks of May we have begun to look at this topic and share with you some thoughts. This is the third part: A leadership team has both an internal and external dynamic. Internally the members come around the priests of the parish to support them and to help them make better decisions by contributing their own specific insights, experience and understanding. This requires a willingness to express contrary points of view within a context of trust and shared responsibility. The external dynamic is most effective when the members of the team complement each other in ways that ensure the discussion and decisions lead to action. There may be no such thing as a 'balanced' individual, but you can have a balanced team:

The four non-negotiables of a leadership team are:

- 1. Unanimity of vision
- 2. Balance of strengths
- 3. Healthy conflict and trust
- 4. Vulnerability (The first two get people on board. The second two keep them there.)

Last week we looked at Unanimity of Vision and Balance of Strengths. Let's look at Healthy conflict and Trust, and Vulnerability this week: As mentioned last week, the primary key to a successful leadership team is unanimity of vision (all agree on a vision for what the parish is to be in the future). Healthy conflict is not only tolerated but is desired. For healthy conflict to exist, there must be trust. Trust allows team members to express different opinions, without seeing it as a personal attack or hurtful, but ultimately, we are all on the same side seeking the same thing. Vulnerability is about being real. The priest being real with his team, and team members being real with one another. No one has all the answers but together, with trust, much can be achieved.

Lectio Divina. On the first Saturday of June, (3rd June) we begin Lectio Divina in our family of parishes. It will be held each Saturday morning at 10.30am in the Presbytery, North Street Skibbereen. ALL ARE WELCOME. Lectio Divina (literally divine readings) is a way of developing a close relationship with God by reflecting prayerfully on His words.

In Lectio Divina, the chosen spiritual text (the Gospel reading for the Sunday) is read four times, giving an opportunity to think deeply about it and respond thoughtfully. It helps us hear specifically and individually from God through Scripture, guided by the Holy Spirit, and deepens our relationship with Him and one another.
