#### THIS WEEK

Mon 8 May: Blessed John Sullivan (1861-1933) was born in Dublin and baptised in the Church of Ireland. Received into the RC Church aged 35, became a Jesuit at Clongowes. Had a reputation as a person of prayer. He was beatified in 2017 in Dublin, the first such ceremony in Ireland.

Mon-Tues, 8-9 May: Time of remembrance and reconciliation for those who lost their lives during World War II.

WED 10 MAY: St Comphall, patron of Lisheen Church (Aughadown Parish). Comghall was born in Co Antrim around 516 and founded a monastery at Bangor, Co Down, also one at Tiree in Scotland. He died in Bangor, on a Pentecost Sunday.

SAT 13 MAY: Our Lady of Fatima, commemorates the Marian apparitions in Fatima Portugal in 1917. In her final apparition on 13 October, the 'Lady' identified herself as Our Lady of the Rosary (patron of Kilcoe Church, Aughadown parish).

**PARISH LEADERSHIP TEAM** – Over the weeks of May we propose to look at this topic and share with you some thoughts. Have you ever come across the ancient proverb?

"If you want to go fast, go alone. If you want to go far, go together".

### What do we mean by Leadership?

The model our church has been operating out of is usually one in which the parish priest is responsible for everything: Liturgies, Pastoral Parish

Councils, Ministries, Finance, Building Maintenance, and all manner of other things for which he may have received little or no information. Sometimes the priest may delegate tasks to individuals, committees, or teams. However, the delegation of tasks is not the same as the delegation of leadership. This can reinforce a view of the lay apostolate which is often seen in terms of taking on activities that in former times had been traditionally reserved to the ordained priest. We should not be using people in this way; we should be helping to build up people so that they can transform society. Leadership is about assuming responsibility rather than completing tasks. We must understand it in terms of a co-responsibility for the mission of the church which is rooted in our baptismal vocation.

**Pope Benedict XVI** expressed it in this way: "Co-responsibility demands a change in mindset especially concerning the role of lay people in the Church".

This is the foundation for the idea of lay 'leadership' within the church. Priests and laity have complementary roles and co-dependent roles so that, "Strengthened by all her members, the Church can thus more effectively fulfil her mission for the life of the world" (Lumen Gentium n.37).

- How do I see or what do I think of people who are involved in our parish?
- Can I accept my role in being co-responsible for the mission of the church?
