# BUILD A COMMUNITY, BRING PEOPLE 'FROM DARKNESS INTO LIGHT' ...

n Saturday 5 May, a hundred or so gathered in Skibbereen for a 5k walk with a difference. It began in darkness at 4.15 am and ended at daybreak.

'How can you tell when night is over and the day has begun?', a famous guru once asked each of his three pupils. 'It's when I can tell the sheep from the goats in the distance', said the first.

The second said: 'When I can distinguish the apple trees from the monkey trees'. And finally the third said: 'It's when I look into the faces of others and see there a brother or sister looking back at me'.

'You have answered well', said the guru 'You are not far from the kingdom'. Hence the Skibbereen walk called 'Darkness into Light'— in support of and befriending those with mental anxieties.

It's human to love and show pity; it's human too to smile, befriend and laugh to-

gether, even do as St. Paul says in today's reading, and 'Greet one another with a kiss'. It's human too 'to celebrate our differences', as John Hume said.

On the day we were baptised, we were baptised into a community, a Christian community: 'I belong to a community. therefore I exist'. This is a bit of wisdom from somewhere.

It's comforting surely and uplifting too for all of us to belong to a community, even more so for the weak and mentally anxious — so hence the walk is called 'Darkness into Light'.

Perhaps for all of us, today's feast of the Blessed Trinity might be about creating that kind of a welcoming, friendly community — with a special look-out for the one on the outside.
