Learn about Vatican II, understand the Synod

The Second Vatican Council, called together by Pope John XXIII in 1959, met in Rome from 1962 to 1965. Documents drawn up by the Council gave expression to ideals and hopes for the renewal of the Church. We have all experienced the fruits of the Council's insights and decisions, greeted with joy by the people of God.

Pope Francis has now called for a new commitment to renewing the Church, in faithfulness to the Council, to other recent documents, and to God's word. He speaks of a synod, rather than of a new Council. A synod literally means "journeying together", talking to one another as lay people, religious, and priests, about God's will for the Church and for the world. What is God calling us to today? The Synod has begun already in conversations in parishes and dioceses around the world. It will come to a head in two sessions in Rome, one in October 2023, the second in October 2024.

As background to help you understand what is going on, we offer you the possibility of reading and studying the documents of Vatican II during the coming year. We will meet once a week to discuss our reading, and share our insights and impressions and questions. We will have our first session on Tuesday, 3 October. We will meet in the Presbytery, Skibbereen, on Tuesdays, from 7.30 to 9.00. Come and share this interesting journey!

THE STATION MASS IN THE HOME: WILL WE PRESERVE IT, OR LET IT GO?

t a recent meeting of the priests in our Family of Parishes, the clergy decided to respond positively to requests for home stations this autumn. We also decided that station masses will not be celebrated in any other venue apart from people's homes, in accordance with the traditional practice.

During the Penal Laws in Ireland, the Catholic Church was oppressed and public ceremonies involving Catholic clergy were banned. Nevertheless, Irish Catholics remained faithful to the Mass and two new traditions emerged: the Mass rock and the Station Mass. As well as Catholics gathering in secluded spots to celebrate Mass, they also gathered in people's homes. Quietly, the word was put

OUR COMMUNITY THIS WEEK Monday 18th marks the fifth anniversary of the death in 2018 of Fr Pat O'Sullivan MSC, the retired PP of Kilmacabea. — MAY HE REST IN PEACE — about locally that Mass would be said in a particular house on a particular day. The neighbours would gather for what was often the only opportunity to attend Mass for a long time. Because it was not safe for the priest to carry sacred vessels or vestments with him on his journeys, these were taken care of by the local people. They passed the "Mass box" from house to house as it was needed. These Masses became known as the "Station Mass" because of the random movement from place to place.

Following the repeal of the Penal Laws and the passing of Catholic Emancipation (1829), Catholics were free to worship publicly. It took a long time for churches to be built widely, so the tradition of the Station Mass continued. Even when each community built its own church, the Station Mass tradition was kept alive. The occasion of having a Mass in your home was seen as a blessing and
