 $\ensuremath{P}\xspace$ ope Francis has spoken often about the environment. Here are just a few quotes:

"..... When a human being allows himself to succumb to selfishness, he ends up defacing even the most beautiful things that have been entrusted to him."

"The pace of consumption, waste and environmental change has so stretched the planet's capacity that our contemporary lifestyle, unsustainable as it is, can only precipitate catastrophes, such as those which even now periodically occur in different areas of the world ... We need to reflect on our accountability before those who will have to endure the dire consequences."

"..... Only rarely does someone admit to having carried out an act of violence to nature, to the earth, to creation. We do not yet have awareness of this sin."

He is often criticised for talking about the environment, especially what he has said in *Laudato Si'*, and the criticism will continue when he publishes Part TwoI shortly. Yet, when we look at recent months around the world, his words ring true. We have seen droughts, floods, fires, melting snow and ice. More countries are paying lip service to solutions and the two largest economies in the world continue to destroy the environment. Even in our Church, some are more interested in bitter politics, particularly in the USA, than leading the way.

We should be guardians of the environment and we can ALL make a difference. Pick three things to do regularly for the environment and do them well.

Second Collection this weekend for the Education to the Priesthood. The annual collection for the Priesthood Education Fund in the Diocese will be taken up this weekend. This year two seminarians will begin studies in St Patrick's College Maynooth. Both completed a year of initial formation in Vallodolid last year. Another man is studying for the Permanent Diaconate in the Diocese. The Priesthood Education Fund will finance their studies as well as costs for ongoing training and education for priests. In the region of $\notin 110,000$ will be needed to meet these costs in the coming year. Last year $\notin 70,616$ was raised in this collection which was very generous. Appreciating that these are difficult financial times, you are asked to be as generous as you can to the Priesthood Education Fund annual collection this year.

"Free to leave, free to stay" - This Sunday is World Day of Migrants and Refugees and in his message, Pope Francis took the story of Joseph's dream, "Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you; for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him" (Mt 2:13). The flight of the Holy Family into Egypt was not the result of a free decision, nor were many of the migrations that marked the history of the people of Israel. The decision to migrate should always be free, yet in many cases, even in our day, it is not. Conflicts, natural disasters, or more simply the impossibility of living a dignified and prosperous life in one's native land is forcing millions of persons to leave. ... Migrants flee because of poverty, fear, or desperation. Eliminating these causes and putting an end to forced migration calls for shared commitment by all, in accordance with the responsibilities of each. This commitment begins with asking what we can do, and what we need to stop doing. We need to make every effort to halt the arms race, economic colonialism, the plundering of other people's resources and the devastation of our common home. ... "All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need" (Acts 2:44-45). The ideal of the first Christian community seems so distant from today's reality! To make migration a choice that is truly free, efforts must be made to ensure that everyone can have an equal share in the common good, respect for his or her fundamental rights, and access to an integral human development. Only in this way will we be able to offer to each person the possibility of a dignified and fulfilling life, whether individually or within families. The question we must ask ourselves as individuals and as a parish - what can we do to ensure that all feel welcomed, cared for and respected. That all feel free to leave, feel free to stay.
