WOULD YOU LIKE TO USE THE BIBLE WHEN YOU PRAY?

ince the beginning of September, a time helps focus further on words that few people have been getting together in the Presbytery in Skibbereen on Saturday mornings. They gather for approximately 45 minutes for *Lectio* divina. Now they would like to welcome others from the family of parishes who may be interested to join in.

Lectio divina ('divine reading') is a prayer method that develops your relationship with God using his words in the scriptures. There are four helpful stages:

- **1. Lectio** (READ) First read the scripture passage. Listen carefully for any words or phrases that strike you, allowing God to give gentle guidance.
- **2. Meditatio** (REFLECT) A slow reading of the scripture passage for the second

strike vou. Reflect on what God is saving. Try your best not to analyse the passage but listen: "Lord grant that I may hear your word for me, loud and clear".

- 3. Oratio (RESPOND) Read the scripture passage a third time, then it's time to respond. Have a conversation with God.
- **4. Contemplatio** (REST) The final reading is followed by silence. People sit quietly and allow God's spirit to work. God uses your imagination to show how much he loves you. End with the Our Father.

Come along some Saturday and give it a try. Lectio divina is on every Saturday morning at 11.15am in the Presbytery, North Street, Skibbereen.

DID YOU KNOW:

- Lectio divina has been practised in the Church since the Fifth Century or earlier.
- It treats the Bible not as a text to be studied but as the Living Word of God.
- You need no biblical expertise for **Lectio**. It's used in parishes all over Ireland.
