# HOW THE STATIONS WERE HELD IN MYROSS IN TIMES PAST

year was the station rounds, when the parish priest and his curate came to the farmhouse to celebrate Mass. The preparation for this was a tedious job. The farmhouse was cleaned out, scrubbed from top to bottom. Every place was spotless as the priest would bless all the rooms in the house and the out-offices. This, the people thought, would give them blessings for the year ahead.

On the night before the Stations, the big wooden kitchen table was raised up a foot or two by placing the crossbeams on two wooden kitchen chairs. A white linen cloth was nailed to the rafters of the ceiling, over the altar table, as an act of respect and to keep any dust off the priest.

The people knelt on the kitchen floor while Mass was being celebrated. They showed great reverence towards this

ne of the great highlights of the Mass. At the interval the priest faced his small congregation. He thanked the people of the Station house and asked, "Whose turn is next for the Stations?" The correct person answered and he recorded it in his ledger. Then each person paid their station dues.

> When the business of the priest came to a conclusion, a number of the parishioners accompanied him to the parlour. Next to the priest sat the person from the townland, who was fluent in conversational matters. The remainder sat and took their places around the breakfast table as they pleased. This was known as the priests' breakfast.

> As dusk grew over the horizon of the station evening, the kitchen was cleared out to make way for the dancing, with music supplied by the accordian. The party continued on through the night.
