HE WROTE AN ACTION-PACKED GOSPEL. BUT WHO WAS MARK?

The Gospel according to Mark will be our companion at Mass readings this coming year. But who was Mark? Scholars say he was a Greekspeaking Jewish Christian, who also understood Aramaic. He was writing for a Greek-speaking audience, unfamiliar with Aramaic expressions and Jewish purification rites, which Mark had to explain.

Mark seems to have been a disciple of the apostle Peter, who taught him all he knew about Jesus. Justin Martyr, who died in 150, speaks of this Gospel as "Peter's Memoirs".

Writing shortly after the death of Peter, and before the fall of Jerusalem and the destruction of the Temple in 70 AD, Mark composed a narrative of the life of Jesus.

ADVENT SERVICE Fr Evin O'Brien will lead the Penitential Service for our Family of Parishes, on Monday 18 December at 7.30 pm in the Cathedral, Skibbereen; several priests will be available for Confession. It faithfully reflects the reality of that life as experienced by Peter, the privileged eye-witness. The Gospel is a wonderfully balanced account of the life of Jesus, and has as its focal point the recognition of Jesus as Messiah by Peter at Caesarea Philippi (Mark 8:27-30).

Mark writes with utter conviction and energy about the events that took place from the baptism of Jesus, through the Galilean ministry, and some journeys outside Galilee, to his Jerusalem ministry, and finally his passion and resurrection. Writing some ten years later, both Matthew and Luke based their accounts on Mark and enlarged it, drawing on another source, in which the "sayings" of Jesus had been collected.

We owe a special debt to the evangelist Mark, the first of the evangelists, whose action-packed Gospel is full of original insights into the mystery of Jesus of Nazareth.
