Report on February Parish Pastoral Council Meeting

The following points were discussed at our first meeting in 2024:

1. The next Children's Mass will take place on Sunday 3rd March 2024.

2. Volunteering for the Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes was discussed. This year's pilgrimage will take place from 20th to 25th September.
