Patrick is everywhere, as Patrick, Pat, Paddy, Pádraig, Patricia, Patsy, Patty, Patie, Patrick's Street in Cork, Croagh Patrick of Co Mayo, Downpatrick in Co Down, St. Patrick's Cathedral, Skibbereen, St. Patrick's Missionary

Society. The list goes on and on.

All this comes from the legend of a young boy kidnapped from his home and enslaved on the wild hills of Ireland, looking after animals. After six years he managed to escape, only to return as a mis-

sionary. He heard the Irish call out to him.

Patrick is honoured as one who converted Ireland to Christianity. Many stories are attributed to him, from chasing the snakes out of Ireland and his lenten fast on

Croagh Patrick for 40 days, his lighting of the Easter fire at Slane, to his teaching of the Trinity using a shamrock. All contribute to his being declared patron saint of Ireland. On this 17 March, we commemorate and celebrate Patrick, as we do every year.

From humble beginnings, great things can happen with the grace of God.

As for myself, someone who took Patrick as a confirmation name, a priest of St. Patrick's Missionary Society and stationed in St. Patrick's Cathedral, Skibbereen. I would

say the same: if we open ourselves to that same grace of God, anything is possible.
