

JOHN F KENNEDY'S ROSARY BEADS

President John F Kennedy was assassinated four months after he visited Ireland in 1963. He went to his ancestral home and met a cousin Mary Ryan.

Mrs Kennedy invited Mary Ryan to the funeral; her daughter Mary Ann attended in her place. After the burial Mrs Kennedy sought out Mary Ann and gave her JFK's rosary beads. The beads are now on display in the Wexford homestead.

Apparently, when he was growing up, JFK's mother gathered the family regularly for the family rosary and taught them to always keep rosary beads in their pockets.

The second story about JFK was revealed by Father James Blount, a priest in Florida. A few days before the assassination, a parish priest in Tampa where Kennedy was speaking, got an inquiry about confessions and was told that the president would arrive for confession. JFK refused to jump the queue and moved along the pew with the others. He came out

from confession, prayed quietly and left.

The article suggested that while the two stories may seem unconnected, those who pray the Rosary and know the 15 promises

made by Our Lady would understand how connected they are. It may be that the article was referring to Promise Number Five which reads:

'The soul that recommends itself to me by recitation of the Rosary shall not perish.'

In a 1991 book 'Padre Pio – the true story' by Bernard Ruffin, the following appears, referring to what Padre Pio said: 'When Kennedy was killed, he told Padre Aurelio that the president was saved.'
