

# HOW TO BECOME AN ECO-FRIENDLY PARISH

he challenges of climate change and loss of biodiversity are enormous. Parishioners often do not know what to do. Begin by identifying the good things already happening. Recognise who is responsible. Success can build on success.

*Eco-Congregation Ireland* is an ecumenical group which offers resources to begin the journey towards an eco-friendly community. A starting point might be to download 'AN ENVIRONMENTAL CHECK-UP' from the website (see back page). It will identify your parish's good practice and future priorities. Not a test, pointers to help the group get started.

Then sign up to join ECI – there is no fee, and the benefits are myriad. To become an eco-friendly parish, a userfriendly guide is provided. Examples of good practice can be found on the website; get the newsletter.

Parishes vary, so no one plan will work across all parishes. Each can progress at its own pace, remembering: 'Do what you can, where you are, with what you have!' Following the initiative of the Irish bishops, many parishes are planning to leave 30% or more of church grounds vacant for nature by 2030.

No matter what shape the eco-journey takes, the light of hope for the care of creation needs be kept alive. Each of us can with small actions make a difference
